# **Food Pantry**



In 2015 Keystone distributed 285,580 pounds of food valued at \$485,486 to 457 low-income local households consisting of 698 adults, 425 children and 101 seniors for a total of 2,702 pantry distributions for the year. The Food Pantry is an integral part of Keystone's continuum of services and is often the entry point for persons to connect with



our education, case management and housing services. Keystone receives food and financial donations for food from our network of partners which include Philabundance and Feeding the Hungry network, as well food collected by individuals and groups such as the Boy Scout Food Drive, the Postal Food Drive and the Souderton Area School District Food Drive.

# **Housing**

KOC's emergency shelter program known as the "Interfaith Hospitality Network" (IHN), part of the national Family Promise network, provided temporary



housing and essential social services for up to 90 days for families with children, or single women experiencing homelessness. In 2015, 30 congregations gave over 21,000 trained volunteer hours and provided transportation, companionship, emergency food and shelter to emergency shelter participants. Over 50% of the families in KOC's IHN

Emergency Shelter moved directly from IHN into permanent housing with private landlords, many with private financial assistance through KOC's Rapid Re-housing program. An additional 25% of families moved into transitional housing.





# **Education**



During program year 2014-2015, the education department served approximately 500 students through our Pennsylvania Department of Education grant and other funded programs. Keystone's education department served the needs of our students by providing English, English Language/Civics, College and Career English, Senior Citizen Survival English, Pre-GED,

GED, and Family Literacy classes across six sites in the Indian Valley and North Penn communities. Keystone also had nine volunteer tutoring pairs and three tutoring groups who met at libraries and churches for tutoring sessions, along with a team of about six aides who assisted instructors in the classroom. Thirty-two of our students reached their goal of becoming naturalized U.S. citizens.

Keystone was, again, recognized by the State for educational functioning level gains in regards to student's pre and post test assessments.


2014 Total Support & Revenue
