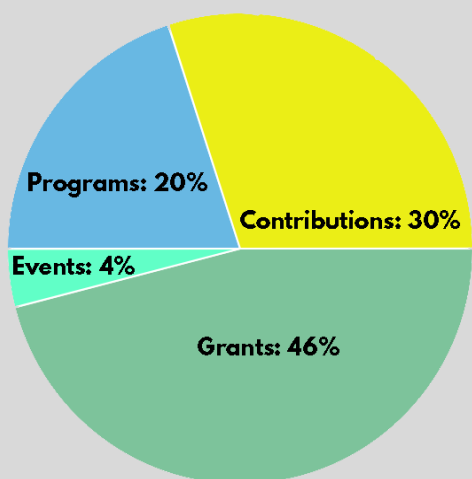

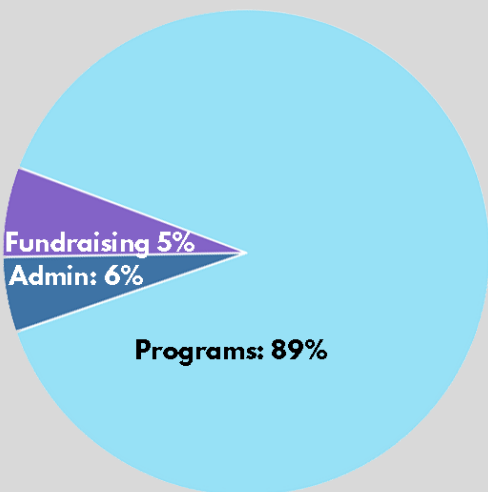
2016 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

EDUCATION

Keystone educated 386 students in High School Equivalency, English as a Second Language, College and Career English, Family Literacy and Citizenship Test Preparation.

HOUSING

Keystone housing programs provided more than 91 households with Emergency Shelter, Rapid Rehousing or Transitional Housing and offered budgeting and financial advice to help 517 households. Keystone also owns and operates 30 low income housing properties which served 36 households.

FOOD

Keystone distributed more than 248,340 lbs of food and personal items to clients in Bucks and Montgomery Counties during 2,491 visits to our pantry in 2016.
